AMISH / MENNONITE - TOUR IN THE EMMENTAL by

Hotel Ochsen Lützelflüh (Emmental); the home of the Amish and Mennonite visitors.

Our ancestor Niggli (Nicholas) Augsburger is mentioned in a letter of 1700 as being a co-worker with Jakob Amman, founder of the Amish Mennonites.

Special rates for the Amish visitors in our B&B: SFr. 45.00 to SFr. 68.00 per person. The large rooms all have Bath and WC. We offer lunch or dinner for groups in our over 200 year old restaurant from 6 up to 100 people at only SFr. 16.00 per person. Lunch comprises a mixed salad, Trueber-Geschnetzeltes with mushrooms and Röschti, dessert with the typical "Brönnti Greeme mit Meränge" plus tea.

A guided tour is offered through the wonderful Emmental valley.

Start is at the farmhouse of Anabaptist martyr Hans Haslebacher in Sumiswald, followed by

Another stop will be at Glockengiesserei (bell factory) Berger in Bärâu (Langnau). A Swiss cowbell is a good reminder of the "sound" of Switzerland. Finally a short visit at the "Bruchbu-Farm" at J.U. Liechtis.

Your tourguide will be Hansueli Augsburger, the owner of the restaurant and B&B who lived in Canada for 10 years. The tour including 2 to 12 people is in English. The price for the tour per person is SFr. 12.-
